Credit Information

Secondary Level Credit Requirements

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Education requires a minimum of 24 credits for graduation, at least 5 of which will be 30 level credits. Credit counts begin at the grade 10 level.

Compulsory courses are:

Grade 10 · English A10, English B10, Native Studies 10 or History 10, Workplace 10 or Foundations Math 10, and Science 10.

Grade 11 · English 20, one 20 level Math, one 20 or 30 level Science, and one 20 or 30 level Social Science.

Grade 12 · English A30, English B30, History 30/ Native Studies 30

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Education also requires students to acquire:

- at least two (2) credits from the Arts Education / Practical & Applied Arts areas at the 10, 20, or 30 level.
- a Wellness or Physical Education credit at the 10, 20, or 30 level is required. Wellness 10 is the recommended credit.

Modified credits are not accepted for university entrance and may limit Saskatchewan Polytechnic entrance. Students may choose to take a modified course and then move back into a regular credit class (ex: Math 11 to Workplace or Foundations Math 10).

Minimum Course Registration in addition to CAP:

Grade 10 - Please select 10 credits

Grade 11 - Please select a minimum of 9 credits

Grade 12 - Please select a minimum of 8 credits

Any class with the letter 'L' (a locally developed course) CANNOT be counted as a core requirement for graduation. It can, however, be included in the general credit count.

Elective classes may have a fee. For information on specific class fees you may contact the office.

IB Requirements and Information

IB Diploma Program Core Components

Full Diploma candidates must complete the core components of CAS, the Extended Essay, and Theory of Knowledge, which they begin in grade 11.

Course candidates may take Theory of Knowledge; those who register for a minimum of **three** IB classes may also take CAS.

Students register for CAS and the Extended Essay with the IB Coordinator. Neither CAS nor the Extended Essay receives a Saskatchewan Ministry of Education credit, but both are recognized on the official IB transcript upon successful completion of grade 12.
